
Talking Folktales (5-8)

Listen to the story about 4 musical animals and find sounds, rhymes and information on every page.


There are key words at the back of the book and children can record onto each page, role playing different characters or telling their own versions of the story.

The Three Billy Goats Gruff


A great way to build a love of reading in children. They can practise recording this story into the TalkingPEN. They can read in different voices, play different characters and then listen back to themselves.
