

Literacy Toolkit (8-12)

Discussion Poster

Pupils can touch areas of this chart to learn about how to write a piece of non-fiction in an discussion style. They can use Recordable Stickers to add their own notes and ideas



Report Poster

Pupils can use this interactive chart to learn about how to write a piece of non-fiction in an report style. They can capture their ideas orally using recordable stickers, and then write them down later.



Book Review Guide

Gives pupils audio tips and hints on how to write a book review. There is a broad range of advice and lots of ideas to get children writing. There's space on the chart for text, which can be wiped clean, or simply add audio stickers and let children record their book reviews orally.



Recount Poster

Pupils have access to in-depth information that will help them to learn how to write a piece of non-fiction in an recount style.



Planning Frames

This set of 6 small posters help children to structure their writing into any of the writing style displayed on the 6 main posters and can be used together with them.
